

The problem:

Human trafficking affects millions globally but only a small number of victims and perpetrators are identified. In addition, many survivors of exploitation do not have access to the kind of justice and compensation they deserve.

- There are nearly 50 million people worldwide who are living in trafficking.
- Of people who are trafficked, 49% are women, 21% are men and 30% children.
- Human trafficking generates USD 150 billion worldwide. Of that, USD 99 billion comes from commercial sexual exploitation.
- In 2018, there were 2,351 prosecutions, 1,275
 convictions and the identification of 5,466 victims in
 East Asia & the Pacific.



Our story

Our organisation began in 2011 when a group of people came together and committed to tackling the crime of human trafficking. It was clear to the founding team of Daniel Walker, Justin and Carolyn Boswell that there was a huge opportunity to take that knowledge and skill set and make a significant impact on trafficking in Southeast Asia.

On a summer's day in 2012 at Waihi Beach in New Zealand, a core group met to begin the organization and deploy experienced law enforcement investigators in Bangkok, Thailand.



What started as an investigative team with an emphasis on removing trafficking victims from slavery has grown to encompass strengthening law enforcement and judicial capabilities to prosecute offenders and protect victims from exploitation. Our goal remains: Freedom through Justice for survivors of human trafficking.

Our approach is to effectively address current cases of exploitation because we believe in prevention through prosecution.

If we lift standards, we lift justice.



Through our multidisciplinary approach involving investigation, aftercare and legal teams, we



identify victims & perpetrators in partnership with law enforcement



protect survivors through aftercare and advocating for their rights



prosecute offenders and seek victim compensation



Our Impact

Since 2011, we have partnered with law enforcement and prosecutors to achieve:

- 800 victims identified and assisted
- USD 34 million in assets seized
- 186 offenders convicted
- 3,627 years of jail time sentenced
- USD 440k in fines from offenders
- USD 802k in victim compensation
